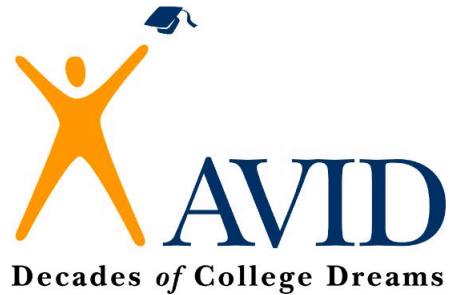


What is AVID?



AVID's mission is to close the achievement gap by preparing all students to succeed within their career choice. The ideal candidates are bright students who have post-secondary goals, the desire to become career ready, and the willingness to work hard. AVID students are capable of completing rigorous course work, but are in need of extra support to thrive in accelerated classes. AVID places these students in challenging/college prep courses with support.

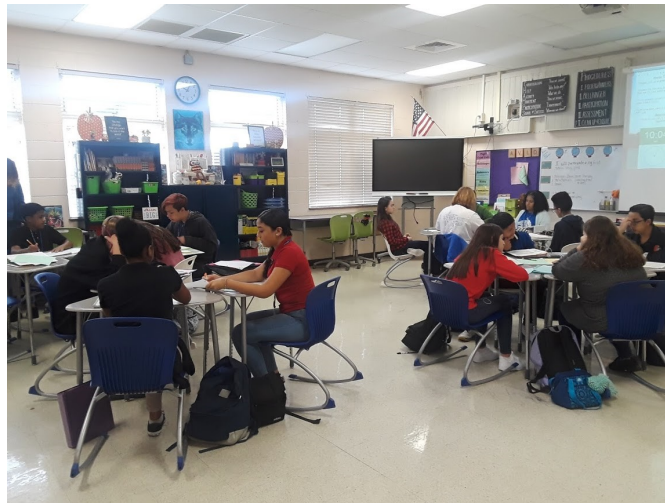
Almost all AVID students who participate for at least three years are accepted to college with more than 80% getting into four-year colleges and universities. AVID students are more likely than students who do not take AVID to succeed when pushing themselves to take Cambridge AICE, Advanced Placement (AP), Dual enrollment courses, and complete their college eligibility requirements to get into four-year colleges.

Eligibility for AVID

- ◆ Students identified as having achieved, and continuously demonstrate, academic, leadership, and personal excellence.
- ◆ Students who currently have a GPA above a 2.5 and have earned satisfactory (passing) scores on standardized exams (3+ on FSA/EOC's).
- ◆ Students with the determination to participate in a rigorous program and have post-secondary goals and the desire to prepare for careers.
- ◆ Have good attendance and behavior
- ◆ May be first generation in family to attend.
- ◆ Demonstrates good citizenship.
- ◆ Able to work well with others.

WICOR Wise!

WICOR is an acronym for the strategies used in AVID classrooms. Practicing these critical areas each day, students become better prepared for college and careers.

W — **Writing**
I — **Inquiry**
C — **Collaboration**
O — **Organization**
R — **Reading**
